relcome to Marietta, Ohio, population: 13,417. Ohio's oldest and very first city situated on 8.75 square miles is rated one of Ohio's top 6 most liveable cities. This charming river city is home to many historical and iconic landmarks, businesses and homes. As the first permanent settlement in the Northwest Territory, you can bet Marietta is full of history lessons that will captivate and inspire you and have you planning your next trip!

# CONVENTION AND VISITORS BUREAU

Located in one of the most iconic buildings in Marietta, The Armory hosts the Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB). A first stop for many visi-

tors, the friendly staff provide knowledgeable information and offer suggestions to make the most of your trip!

# MEMORIAL TO THE START WESTWARD MONUMENT

Standing sentinel in Muskingum Park is the Memorial to the Start Westward Monument. Designed by Gutzon Borglum, the artist behind Mount Rushmore, the monument was completed in 1938 and dedicated by the then president, Franklin D. Roosevelt. Carved from local sandstone, the sculpture depicts three Revolutionary War pioneers looking toward America's new territory. Behind these pioneers sits a woman, while pioneers unload the boat. This monument embodies the first landing of pioneers and the

beginning of the westward expansion of our young country. A temporary shelter provides protection while this memorial undergoes restoration.

### THE VALLEY GEM

Built in 1989, the Valley Gem Sternwheeler is an authentic replication of the early stern—wheeler models. Once navigated by the early pioneers, the Ohio and Muskingum Rivers are sights to behold. The Valley Gem offers a narrated histo—ry cruise, an evening dinner cruise, specialty cruises and private charters, creating unique experiences for your group or party.

### **MOUND CEMETERY**

Early pioneers found several mounds in the area, had them





surveyed, mapped and protected. Originally built by the Hopewell and Adena, the most impressive remaining mound is the Conus Mound, sitting 30 feet above Mound Cemetery. From the top of the mound, you can see several monuments and tombstones. Many headstones bear the names of our notable pioneers. Within

its bounds, Mound Cemetery has more Revolutionary War officers buried than any other cemetery in the U.S.

### LAFAYETTE HOTEL

Paying homage to the spectacular river boat era, the historic Lafayette Hotel was built in 1918. It's name was given after a visit from the

French hero of the Revolutionary War, Marquis De Lafayette. The hotel has beautiful public areas and rooms are furnished with antiques.

### THE CASTLE

Located on Fourth street, the Castle Museum is one of Ohio's finest examples of Gothic Revival architecture. Originally leased to potter Nathaniel Clark in the early 1800's, it is one of the first pottery manufacturing sites in the Northwest Territory. In 1855, attorney Melvin Clark built the impressive home for \$10,000 and completed the carriage house. Surrounded by lush gardens of herbs and perennials, the home and carriage house was the site for many grand events and Victorian weddings. In 1929, Jessie Davis Lindsay inherited the Castle, where she lived until her death in 1974. Many of the rooms are furnished with her personal items. In addition many of the rooms are furnished to





depict the lifestyle of distinguished Marietta homeowners and encompasses some of their personal items. The Castle hosts educational workshops and special events throughout the year.

### **CAMPUS MARTIUS MUSEUM**

In 1788, Marietta's founding father, General Rufus Putnam led his group of Revolutionary War generals to carve out a settlement and city and what was Ohio wilderness. Putnam's house was left in its original location, where it remains today within the walls of the museum. Exhibits illustrate artifacts and possessions of these early pioneers, including Manasseh Cutler, founder of Ohio University and Samuel Hildren, pioneer physician and scientist. Displays further recount the history of ancient peoples who occupied the land centuries before.

### THE ANCHORAGE

Overlooking Historic Harmar Village in Marietta is the Anchorage. Built in 1859 by Douglas Putnam for his wife Eliza, this home has 22 rooms and a grand tall belfry. From this tower room, both the Muskingum and Ohio Rivers as well as the majority of Marietta can be seen. Master builder and architect John Slocomb

built this "villa" with thick, local sandstone, solid rock and locally grown oak woods. This mansion served as the residence for many prominent Marietta citizens and is currently undergoing rehabilitation sponsored by the Washington County Historical Society. Private tours are offered at the Anchorage, "The house that watches over us."





# BELPRE FARMERS CASTLE MUSEUM

Nestled in the second settlement town of Belpre, is the Belpre Farmers Castle Museum and Education Center. Visitors can check out early pioneer and Native American displays and artifacts.

### PEOPLES MORTUARY MUSEUM

Packed full of vintage and antique embalming tools, caskets and funeral accessories, The People Mortuary Museum hosts an unusual but fascinating visit. Visitors can see restored hearses, including the rare Packard, and horse drawn hearses. Call ahead to arrange a tour of what we loving call the "lively" mortuary museum!

### **SCOTTS SUPER ADVENTURES**

Tour Marietta from a different viewpoint by riding a segway with Scotts Super Adventures.

This fun mode of transportation comes with a personal narrated tour while riding outdoors, soaking up the sun.

# CHILDREN'S TOY AND DOLL MUSEUM

Take time to check the wide range of vintage children's toys, dolls and displays in this beautifully restored nine room home. In Harmar this museum is a great reminder of children's play times that will likely kindle memories of your own childhood.

### HENDERSON HALL

Across the river in Williamstown, W.V., is the perfectly preserved Victorian-Era, 29 room, Italianate Mansion overlooking the Ohio River. The home was finished in 1859 by Alexander Henderson Sr. Two of his sons helped thwart former Vice President Aaron Burr's treasonous plot by alerting President Jefferson and the then Secretary of State, James Madison of Burr's scheme. The home illustrates timeless artifacts, furnishings and documents that record events of the era. The property is also home to multiple Adena burial mounds and hosts what is believed to be the oldest schoolhouse in Wood County.

### **OHIO RIVER MUSEUM**

Now closed for reconstruction The Ohio River Museum is a must see for steam boat enthusiasts. Exhibits describe the steam boat's importance to a developing country, as well as the natural history and evolution of the Ohio River. See tools, equipment and the pride of the museum, the W.P. Snyder Jr., the last of the steam powered sternwheeler towboats in the United States.

### BLENNERHASSETT ISLAND HISTORICAL PARK

The Ohio RIver's most famous island is located in Parkersburg, WV. Settled in 1789 by aristocrats Harman and Margaret Blennerhassett, the couple built their impressive estate. In 1805, they allowed their estate to become the headquarters for Aaron Burr's military expedition which led to the highly polarized political scandal. The Blennerhassetts lost their fortune and fled the island when the scheme collapsed. The Palladian mansion was lost to a fire in 1811 but was reconstructed to original details in the 1990's. Once walked by Johnny Appleseed, Walt Whitman and Henry Clay, you can tour the grounds by taking a ferry to the island.

### **TROLLEY TOURS**

Popular with families and groups of all ages, Trol-ley Tours are available May through October. A guided narrative with many facts you won't find in a book, the trolley visits several historic sites and buildings throughout the city.

### **HENRY FEARING HOUSE**

Built in 1847 by Henry Fearing, the iconic Harmar home illuminates Marietta's Victorian – era, middle class. Henry was the son of the first lawyer in the Northwest territory, Paul Fearing. The Fearing family were prominent members of the community, developing properties and investments including the local steamboat enterprises. Henry lived in his home until his death in 1894.

### **OLIVER TUCKER MUSEUM**

The Oliver Tucker Museum, home of the Lower Muskingum Historical Society is located Beverly. Built in 1850 by Beverly's



founder Joseph Dogde Esq., this home has many exhibits and antique artifacts.

### MATAMORAS AREA HISTORI-CAL SOCIETY MUSEUM

Nearly thirty minutes north of Marietta this museum resides


in New Matamoras. Housed in a building built in 1895, the Matamoras Area Historical Museum was once the home of several businesses through the years, including a library, post office, funeral parlor and a hardware store.

# **Save Historic Harmar Bridge**

Initially built as a covered bridge in 1856, the Harmar Bridge was converted to a railroad bridge in the 1860s, making it one of the first iron bridges during the Civil War period, the oldest swinging railroad bridge in the country, and the only one of its kind still in operation today. The Historic Harmar Bridge Company made the decision to close the Harmar Bridge to pedestrian traffic until the structure has been fully restored.

There is an ongoing initiative to save the Historic Harmar Bridge which aims to create a safe and accessible pathway for pedestrian and bicycle traffic across the Muskingum River. Log onto



minum alloy castings and won over the commission with his Sewah Markers. That project created 110 large markers and over 400 smaller markers, making them the first of thousands of road side markers now seen throughout the United States.

Nearly 30 years later, in the early 1950's The Ohio Historical Markers program began. Each year, nearly 20 new markers are accepted into the program across the state! Ohio has over 1,750 markers and in Washington County alone, over 120 historical markers are listed in the historical database!







Sewah Studios was founded and still resides in Mariet-ta! In 1953, Hawes sold the company to Gerald E. Smith. Smith and his brother-in-law Lloyd Thomas moved and constructed their new factory to its current location on Mill Creek Road. The company has been passed down through generations and is now

owned and operated by the third generation, Brad Smith. Today Sewah Studios has 22 employees, produces more than 1,200 markers per year.

ore than just a backdrop, Marietta's public art displays are an integral part of the community. These murals and works of art add great value to the culture, aesthetic, and feel of the area. Studies show that investments in public art can combat anxiety and social isolation, enhance tourism, and even increase street safety. These beautiful murals can make us pay attention and can capture

the eye and mind, even if for just a moment.

Along Marietta's paved bike path, under the Putnam Street bridge is a stunning underwater dreamscape that features the native marine life of the Ohio and Muskingum River. Designed by local artists and coordinated by the Marietta Main Street public art committee, a group of 11 artists finished this amazing mural in under four days.

On the side of MOVE, Mid-Ohio Valley Employment, you can see the giant Rooted in Kind-ness, Good Things Grow Here mural. In a high traffic area, its beautifully painted message and flowers make for a stunning backdrop, or the not-so-subtle reminder that kindness helps build our community and that good things really do grow here.

The history focused series on Butler Street delivers a neat way





to imagine yourself as an early pioneer. From the Marietta College Library of History, Special Collections, these murals were hand-picked from incredible photographs and painted two panels at a time.




The Original Pizza Place has a new mural and is quite popular with the younger crowd! Be sure to tag them on Facebook with your cheesiest smile!

Newly renovated and re-opened with a new name in tow, the Peoples Bank Theatre has now become the premier live music venue in the MOV. Jazz, Rock & Roll, Country? They have it! Orchestra and ballet? # RIVER CITIES SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA



n the west side of downtown Marietta is the historic neighborhood of Harmar. Constructed originally as Fort Harmar prior to the permanent establishment of the city, it later became a distinct neighborhood of Marietta. In 1856, Marietta and Harmar were connected across the Muskingum River by a 900foot covered bridge. Nearly two decades later the then Marietta and Cincinnati Railroad acquired the bridge and replaced the original covered bridge with an iron superstructure that had a central swing span. The B&O abandoned Harmar Bridge in 1962. In 1980, the non-profit Harmar Bridge Company was

formed and began fundraising to add a pedestrian walkway along the bridge. Now temporarily closed to the public for restoration, we are confident that this historic bridge will once again become the perfect avenue for folks passing from one side of the Muskingum to the other on foot or by bike.

Harmar is still home to the short line Belpre Industrial Parkersburg Railroad. On occasion while traveling on Harmar Street, you'll hear the familiar sound of train whistle notifying you of an on-coming train. But there is nothing to fear- the slow-moving giant gives you plenty of time to pull to the

side of the road while waiting for the iron horse to pass by.

There are many restored rail cars for the train enthusiast to get up close and personal with next to the historic Harmar Post Office. The train cars make the perfect photo op for the passerby as you meander the quaint streets on the Harmar side of town.

### HARMAR DAYS FESTIVAL

Celebrating the steamboat era and the magnificent Harmar Bridge (all while helping fundraise for the bridge repairs) the public is invited to experience the popular Harmar Days Festival. This annual event happens the last weekend of July each year and features food trucks, crafters, a car show, steam engines, great live music and more.

### HENRY FEARING HOUSE

With any visit to the Harmar Village, you'll want to check out the home of Ohio's first attorney, the Henry Fearing House on Gilman. They offer tours May through October. Just down the street is The Children's Toy and Doll Museum, a fun trip down memory lane.

### THE ANCHORAGE

Standing tall on Putnam Street you'll find the Anchorage, "The house that watches over us." This mansion is home to a local tour company, Hidden Marietta and has a gift shop on site. They offer special tours, ghost hunts, and haunted history tours. You can tour The Anchorage, where it is said the bitter spirit of Douglas Putnam's late wife Eliza, paces the tower, jealous of women who later took residence in this stately mansion.

### **SHOPPING AND DINING**

While Harmar is full of historic landmarks, it's also home to



# L.E. HUCK AND SONS FARM MARKET

Just outside of Marietta, this market bustles with customers



n western Washington County and along the Ohio River sits the friendly little town of Belpre. Originally named "Belle Prairie", this picturesque town was the second permanent settlement in the Northwest Territory. It's home to the first woman school teacher, Bathsheba Rouse, who was employed by the community and later by the Ohio Company to teach in the Farmers Castle Fort from 1791 to 1795.

In 1795, Colonel Israel Putnam brought his share of the Putnam family library in Connecticut to Belpre, making it the first circulatory library in the Northwest Territory.

### **BLENNERHASSETT ISLAND**

One of Belpre's most famous river attractions is Blenner-hassett Island. Owned by West Virginia, the island lies parallel to Belpre and has a clear, un-obstructed view across the river

from Civitan Park. The Blennerhassett's arrived and built the magnificent estate in 1798 but their involvement in the political scandal with Aaron Burr forced the landowners to flee the island. Unfortunately, the original mansion was lost to an accidental fire in 1811, however, in 1973, the original foundation was uncovered and the mansion was re-created. The now-museum hosts fascinating artifacts and displays not only of the early pioneers, but also the ancient people who inhabited the area many years prior.

### **CIVITAN PARK**

Belpre has a small-town charm that is bustling with businesses, new and old. It's home to Civitan Park, which hosts the Belpre Homecoming Festival- three full days of music, concessions, pageants and rides. Civitan Park is also home to the Belpre Holiday Lights, an extraordi-

nary Christmas light display that brings many visitors to the area. Beginning Saturday after Thanksgiving, visitors can enjoy over 200 hand crafted light displays that are fun for the whole family.

### **FARMERS CASTLE MUSEUM**

Perhaps the most notable destination in the area is the Belpre Farmers Castle Museum. The Farmers Castle Museum is named for the fortification that protected early pioneers from Indian attacks. The Museum and Education Center is located on Ridge Street and offers a look into the early Native American encampments and has an extensive Underground Railroad display, deemed the best in southeast Ohio.

If you're looking for a bite to eat while visiting, Belpre has many new restaurants as well as established town favorites.

### THE REDWOOD RESTAURANT

The Redwood Restaurant offers classic American dishes and desserts and is family owned and operated. A great family diner where you're sure to feel welcome, the Redwood offers some of the best pie in the county!

### LAS TRANCAS

Are you hungry for some authentic Mexican Food? Then you'll definitely want to try out Las Trancas! Belpre's newest restaurant is quickly becoming one of the busiest places in town, offering freshly made Mexican cuisine with indoor and outdoor seating options.

### THE UNICORN WINE GUILD

The Unicorn Wine Guild and Tea Room is an urban winery, tea room, gift shop and more. They serve afternoon tea by reservation, a light lunch and/or wine tasting any time they are open and during special events. They also carry wine and beer-making supplies, offer classes and have an on-premise winery.

### NEFF'S COUNTRY LOFT

A visit to Neff's Country Loft and Quilt Shop is a must when visiting Belpre! Laughter, camaraderie, and an ever-expanding inventory provide comfort to all who enter Beverly Neff's shop nestled near the end of town. Not just a quilt shop, you can also find home décor, candles, gifts and much more.

### BACK TO BASICS LOG CABIN

Iust outside of city limits, be sure to make a stop at Back to Basics Log Cabin. This charming cabin shop has a full line of natural beauty and skin care products as well as jewelry, home decor, and unique gifts. The shop's owner and employees can help you find just what you're looking for.

### **OXBOW GOLF COURSE**

A short drive down SR339 you will see the Oxbow sign, which directs you to a naturally beautiful, 18-hole golf course in rural Washington County. Oxbow Golf Course is a combination of challenging golf holes matched with beautiful scenery which makes for an enjoyable day of golf in Washington County.

### **DUNBAR PIERS**

While in Vincent another interesting stop are the Dunbar Piers. Constructed in the mid-1800s as a bridge for the Marietta and Cincinnati Railroad, all that remain are three piers and two abutments. Carved of sandstones from surrounding hills, this structure supported trains over the valley until it was abandoned in 1916.

### VETERANS GALLERY OF ARTS

In Little Hocking, a fascinating collection of paintings featuring George H.W. Bush's military career can be seen at the Veterans Gallery of Arts. Nearly 100 works of the artist Thomas Stahl are on display. Fun fact- the painting that started this collection proudly hangs in the Bush Presidential Library. On the same site, be sure to visit Stahl's Christmas Shop for everything Christmas! Nativity scenes, decorations, unique

ornaments and more.

### **BOORD STATE NATURE PRESERVE**

Take a ride out of town on State Route 555 with its winding curves and you will come to the quaint town of Cutler, home to the Boord State Nature Preserve. Falls Run cuts through a large layer of Permian-age sandstone forming the heart of the preserve, an eastern hemlock shrouded stream gorge that is 60 to 80 feet deep. There are multiple scenic cliffs and overhangs with impressive landscape views in this area.

### TRIPLE NICKEL GETAWAY

Another great spot along the winding road that is State Route 555 is the Triple Nickel Getaway in Bartlett. Offering a secluded apartment in a country setting where you can relax, fish in the private pond, and enjoy the views of a nearby working farm. You can find info about renting this getaway on AirBnB.com and in our hotel listings on page 57.





### **OLIVER TUCKER MUSEUM**

Operated by the Lower
Muskingum Historical Society
the Oliver Tucker house was
built in 1850, by the town's
first settler, Joseph Dodge, Esq.
On the grounds of this historic
home sets a log cabin built by
Marvil Starlin Sr., in the 1790's
and is believed to be the oldest completely hand-hewn log
home of the Northwest Territory on a museum property.

# Newport & New Matamoras

### LAKESIDE HOTEL AND **GOLF COURSE**

If you head north on Route 60, you'll find the cozy Lakeside Hotel and Golf course. The course is located just 17 miles North of Marietta. This course offers 18 holes and 6,318 yards of championship golf.

### **LOWELL**

Southeast of Beverly on Route 60, you'll find the little town of Lowell. This settlement was laid out on November 8, 1837 and was named with the idea that it would grow into a large manufacturing city similar to Lowell, Massachusetts. With lots of early pioneer history to be discovered, this cozy little community is now home to about 560 people.

### **BUELL ISLAND AND OCTOBER FEST**

Lowell is home to Buell Island which hosts the annual October Fest. The festival is an annual tradition and the festivities include homemade German food, live entertainment, and a large flea market.

### STRAIT RUN ONE ROOM **SCHOOL HOUSE**

During the festival, tour the Strait Run One Room School House located on the island. Originally located in a field along Strait Run near Lowell, the historical society decided in 1994 to move the building to its present location on Buell Island. Since then several hundred people visit the schoolhouse every year-many during the Octoberfest when the building is left open for tours. Other times of the year tours are offered by appointment.

early 30 miles north of Marietta reside the towns of Newport and New Matamoras. Founded originally as Matamoras in 1797, by the James Riggs family, this little town rests on the banks of the Ohio River. Riggs and his son-in laws cleared land and built three log cabin homesteads. Like most of Washington County, many of the first settlers were Revolutionary War veterans. Close to 65 years after their settlement, Matamoras was incorporated and received its very first post office. That same year, the post office changed the village name to New Matamoras to help alleviate the confusion with the Ohio town, Matamoras.

A few miles south of New Matamoras is the historic town of Newport. Founded a year after New Matamoras, the Dane family from Massachusetts and shortly after, the Greene Family of Rhode Island cleared and erected several log cabins. The town was not platted until 1839, but the local post office has been in operation since 1815.

### JUDGE JOSEPH BARKER JR **HOUSE**

A restoration is underway with the intention that in the next few years, you'll be able to visit the Judge Joseph Barker Jr., House. Built in 1832 by Judge Joseph Barker Jr.'s father, Joseph Barker. Joseph Barker was a local craftsman and built many homes for the well to do in the surrounding areas. One of his most esteemed



clients was that of Harman Blennerhassett, of Blennerhassett Island. Today the house is one of the very few remaining works that showcase the craftsmanship of time gone by and the community is looking forward to the day that the home will be restored.

### THE JUG

An iconic restaurant along Route 7 is The Jug. Known for their dairy bar and most delicious hot dogs with sauce, this eatery is one you won't want to miss. Each June, they host the annual Jug Fest, with great food, door prizes, raffles, live music and a car show (which can bring over 100 cars!). Talk about a great way to welcome the summer season!

### WAYNE NATIONAL FOREST-KINDERHOOK HORSEBACK TRAIL

Nestled along Route 7 is a stretch of the Wayne National Forest, and its newest trail system, Kinderhook Horseback Trail. With nearly 12 miles of scenic riding, this trail winds through steep hills, open fields, mature forests and new forests. It's open year-round for hiking and mountain biking, but is closed to horseback winter through early spring.





surrounded by rushing rivers and picturesque hills, Washington County's natural beauty and recreational venues draw new outdoor enthusiasts to the area each year. Whether you bike, run, swim or hike, Marietta and Washington County have an endless supply of outdoor adventures.

# BROUGHTON NATURE AND WILDLIFE EDUCATION AREA

This 500-acre preserve is located in Devola and offers a myriad of adventures for the outdoor enthusiast. Nature and wildlife study areas, hunting and fishing spots, cross country courses, and a fabulous disc golf course await you at Broughton. They also offer picnic shelters as comfy places to eat and rest from your adventures.

New in 2022, Broughton's land now joins the Devola Multi Use Trail and the Rudolph Family Park Trails that provide access to the Marietta City Trails.

# WAYNE NATIONAL FOREST

Stretching from the bottom to the top of Washington County is the Wayne National Forest. In the Appalachian foothills, this patchwork of public land offers the outdoor enthusiast a grand adventure. Bird watching, ATV riding, camping, horseback and trail hiking are just a few options to explore! Gear up for rock climbing adventure with your friends at Baker Run. While hiking, breathe in the fresh air of the Wayne National Forest and be sure to bring binoculars so you can spot wildlife along the way.

### **KAYAKING AND CANOEING**

Paddle down the Muskingum River through the locks and dams that are part of the state park system. Beverly, and Lowell host two of the Muskingum River Parkway's lock and dam sites. This hand operated dam system is the last of its kind in the United States, and one of two left in the world. Or, kayak to the center of the Ohio River to Buckley Island.

### **HUNTING**

The wilderness of Southeast Ohio is known for its plentiful game. Hunters from all over the world flock to the state in search of deer, wild turkey, pheasant, and quail that thrive in the hills and valleys of Washington County.

### **FISHING**

Washington County has many peaceful fishing spots tucked away along the waterways. With two rivers, a lake, and many streams, public fishing areas abound.

### **CAMPING**

Leith Run is a popular site for campers to spend a few nights under the stars in Wayne National Forest, Ohio's only national forest. Enjoy horseback riding, kayaking, canoeing and other outdoor activities before gathering around the campfire with a cup of hot cocoa in hand. If a cozy RV is more your style, our partner campgrounds information is listed on page 57.

### **MARIETTA CITY TRAILS**

If a peaceful stroll is how you roll, the River Trail is a paved surface perfect for walking, bicycling with family, or taking Fido for a leisurely stroll. For the more adventurous, the Marietta Trail Network leads through many miles of off-road terrain, ideal for hiking and mountain biking.

### **GUNLOCK PARK**

This mapping system allows the plots to be laid out by not just who owns them, but who lies there. He has also been able to replace 26 headstones that were deteriorated and unreadable. Though a long way from completion, Mike's countless volunteer hours on this project are enabling the community and the many visitors to Mound Cemetery to honor those who have made a mark on Marietta. Mike's friendly, positive attitude and his passion for preserving Marietta's history make a difference in our community, and he demonstrates the attributes of a true hometown hero.



Marietta native, Patrick Engle, understands the importance of community which is why he makes it a point to support those around him. Patrick is well known as "the therapist that not only works on your back, but gives back" and he embodies this phrase to the fullest. He generously donates 30% of his profits to local organizations including sports teams and the Salvation Army.

During his adolescence, Patrick lived with his grandmother who instilled a passion for natural healing in him. Together, they ran an herbal shop out of their house and attended natural healing seminars to boost their proficiency. Whether through his philanthropical giving or his work at Engle's Natural Healing and Massage, his love of community shines brightly.

A Washington County native, Larry Sloter appreciates the importance of Harmar Village and has been a key player in its revitalization. Since his purchase of the Busy Bee in 2016, Larry has made improvements to the space and established the Harmar Village Restaurant Group. His other businesses include Harmar Village Catering Company, Baked on Maple, The Butchery, real estate ventures, and the soon to be Derailed Distillery.

While each establishment has their own touch, they all follow suit by utilizing ingredients from local farms, something that the Busy Bee has been promoting for over 75 years. Larry notes that, "Our area is too agriculturally rich to not take advantage of what's in front of us." He adds that in doing this, he is able to see his dollars going back to the families of the farmers.

His role as Chairman of the board for the Historic Harmar Bridge Company has enabled Larry to further promote the revitalization of Harmar Village as they work to raise funds to reopen the beloved bridge. Larry is an asset to our community and a great friend to many.





Love of history is what drew Melisa, better known as "Viva" Farris to Marietta thirteen years ago. This same love attracted her to Hidden Marietta, where she has been a co-owner for the last two years.

Viva plays an integral role in Hidden Mariet—ta's Paranormal Expo being held at the Washington County fairgrounds. This event hosts over eighty vendors and allows others to hear stories of haunt—ed locations, learn the secrets of investigations, and shop an assortment of creepy merchandise.

Viva enjoys researching and promoting Marietta's rich history which carries over to the revitalization of Hidden Marietta's headquarters, the Anchorage. The team at Hidden Marietta understands the importance of preserving this historic landmark and has been

working alongside the Washington County Historical Society to preserve and beautify the space. Viva always dons a sweet smile and her positive and cheery disposition make her a favorite among the patrons of Hidden Marietta's tour guides.

# **Riverboat Days**



Marietta is a greeting that speaks to both Marietta's past and present. From before the establishment of our city through today, the

rivers have been a major factor in moving people and goods into and out of the area. Flatboats and paddle wheelers ruled the rivers in the early days and gave way to today's vessels. Locat-



ed in the midst of a hardwood forest, Marietta took an active role in the maritime industry. Our founders came from New England and used their knowledge and experience to establish this area as a boat building region, producing high quality ocean-going vessels. From 1800 to 1812 Marietta boatyards produced 29 sailing vessels, and another 7 between 1845 and 1847. The flood of 1913 swept away all bridges and most shore facilities along the Muskingum River and Marietta's boat builders moved their operations to Point Pleasant, West Virginia.

Riverboats were the most profitable method of moving goods and people for many years. Early photos of the Marietta riverfront show paddle wheelers packed along the levee.



The riverboat era continued until after the Civil War, when railroads expanded throughout the region and became the dominant player. Commercial traffic on the river steadily moved away from passengers to cargo and ultimately to today's pattern of mostly tow boats moving barges. But the grand riverboats are back. Every summer, cruise operators send their vessels on voyages to the inland waterways. Ships designed to relive the paddle wheelers of the past with names like American Queen, American Heritage and others make their way up the Ohio River to moorings at the levee on Marietta's historic waterfront.

Modern day adventurers and explorers fill the cabins on the boats and come to Marietta to experience both the past and present. Our town's history has been documented by author David McCullough in his book "The Pioneers", and in the fictional series "Secrets of The Wayfarer's Inn". People come to visit the sites featured in the

books and the history that they represent. They come for the opportunity to journey through the part of the country known as Appalachia. Many visitors come looking for the local arts, crafts and goods that are created here. Others come to see the city itself. Marietta's historic homes and churches are internationally known. The downtown shopping and dining district has been recognized as an example for other regional communities.

When the riverboats come to town, the celebrations begin. The cruise passengers tour the city stopping to visit historic churches, the Mound Cemetery, and museums, including Campus Martius, where they can visit the home of our founder, Rufus Putnam. Visitors are not allowed to board the vessels but, they make a great backdrop for commemorative photos. While the ship is docked, there might be street

performers and even musicians for entertainment.

Our community honors its riverboat heritage every September with the Ohio River Sternwheel Festival. The festival attracts visitors from everywhere and features an annual gathering of enthusiasts who own their own paddle wheel vessels and crowd the riverfront levee for a full week. Visitors can view these boats and watch as our own local excursion boat, the Valley Gem sternwheeler passes by.

# Blennerhassett Island

# TAKE A DAY TRIP BACK IN TIME

The history of Blennerhassett Island has made it the Ohio River's most famous island. In 1789, the island was settled by Harman and Margaret Blennerhassett, wealthy aristocrats fleeing political persecution and personal scandal. Over the years, the couple's mansion gained a reputation for being the West's most beautiful home. Then, in 1805, they allowed their estate to become headquarters for Aaron Burr's military expedition to the Southwest, an episode that raised the island to national renown and awarded it a permanent footnote in American history. The Burr conspiracy has become the subject of many stories, poems, artwork and Broadway shows. The Blennerhassetts fled the island when Burr's scheme collapsed but the mansion and history remain.
